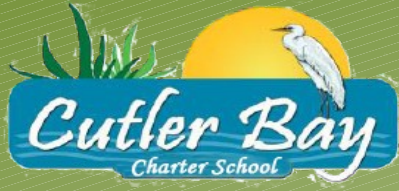

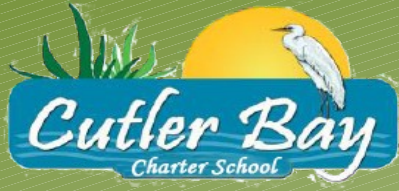
Cutler Bay Charter School

- Proposed initial facility: Town Building



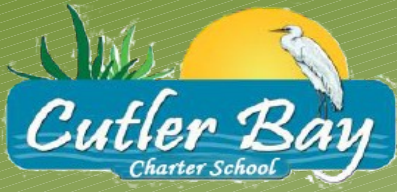
Charter Schools are

- PUBLIC SCHOOLS, and among the fastest growing school choice options in Florida
- Tuition-free PUBLIC schools of choice
- Authorized by Miami Dade County Public Schools
- Provide innovative learning opportunities
- A parental choice--student are not assigned to the school, they choose to attend
- Accountable for academic results and finances



Charter schools in a municipality

- Charter schools-in-a-municipality are sponsored by local school districts in partnership with a municipality
- Such schools enroll students based upon a random lottery that includes all of the children of the residents of the municipality (Preference given to Cutler Bay Students)
- Maintain racial/ethnic balance reflective of the community or other public schools in the same school district

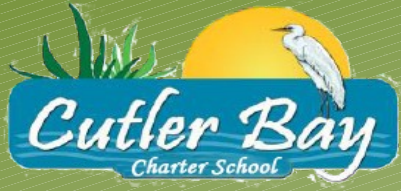

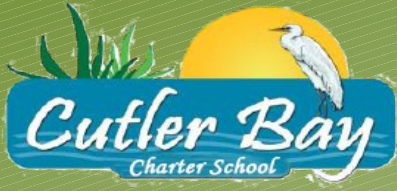

Fast Facts

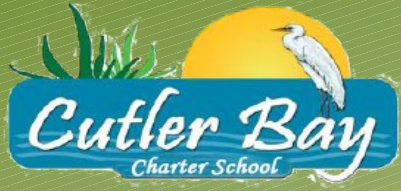
- Former President Clinton called for the creation of 3,000 charter schools by the year 2002 in his 1997 State of the Union Address

LEGISLATIVE GUIDING PRINCIPLES

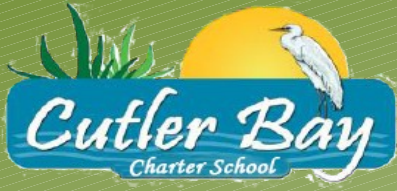
Charter Schools meet high standards of student achievement by:

- Mitigating the educational impact created by the development of new residential units

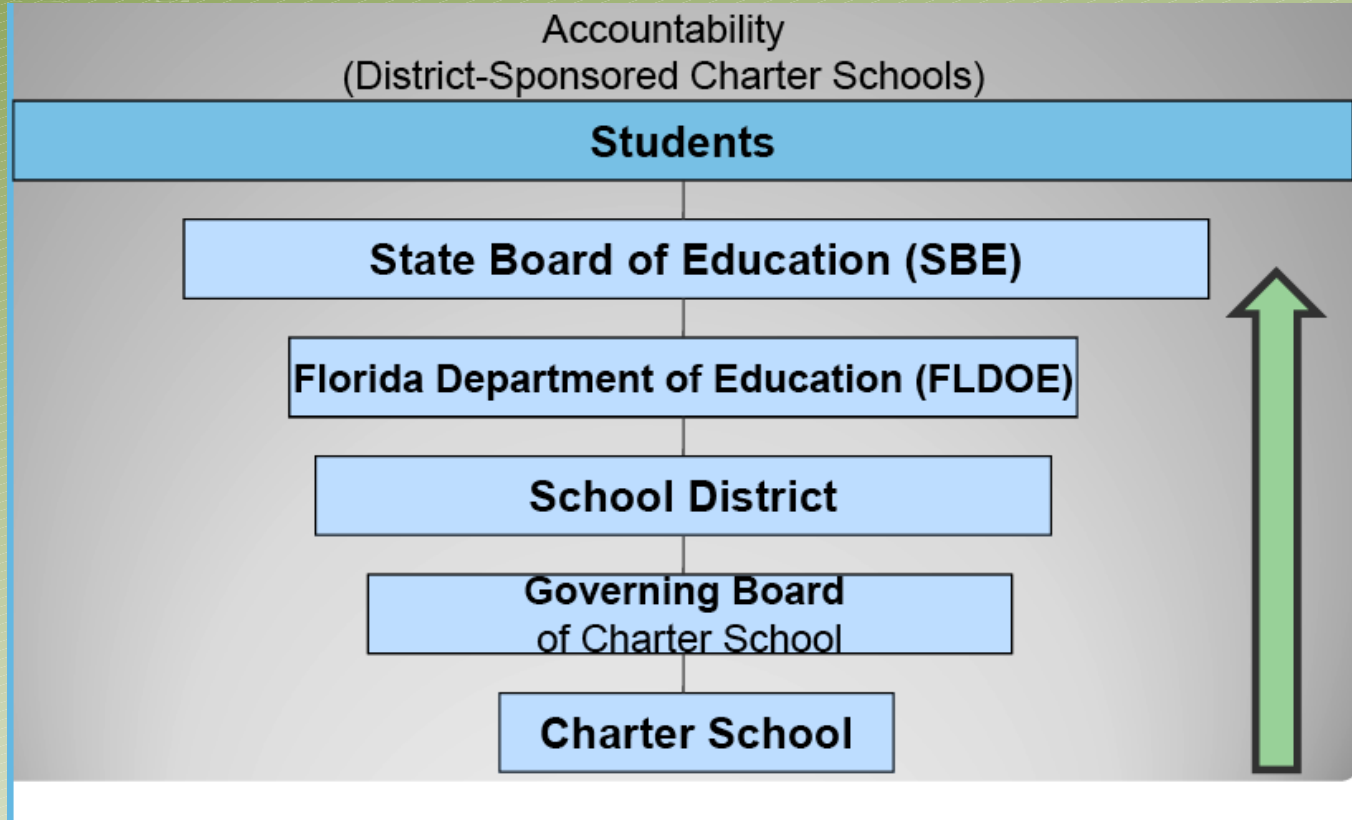


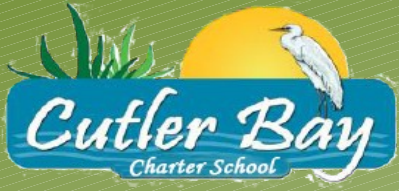
Teachers

Accountability

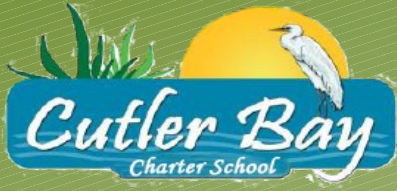




Accountability

A Charter is a contract between the charter school and the school district

- The sponsor (MDCPS) may close a charter school if the school fails to meet student performance, fiscal management, violates the law, or shows other good cause
- The school must submit an annual report to the sponsor (MDCPS). The sponsor (MDCPS) then submits the report to the Commissioner of Education
- Charter schools are evaluated and assigned a school grade using the same standards and criteria as traditional public schools



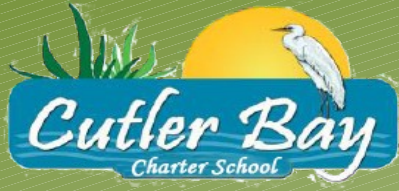
Charter School Operation

Funding source:

- (FTE) Full Time Student Enrollment funds as calculated by the State. These funds “go with the students” to their school of choice

Operation:

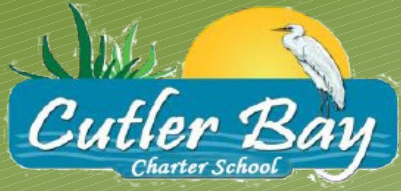
- Oversight Board
- A management company hired solely for the operation of the school and under the oversight of the Charter School Board



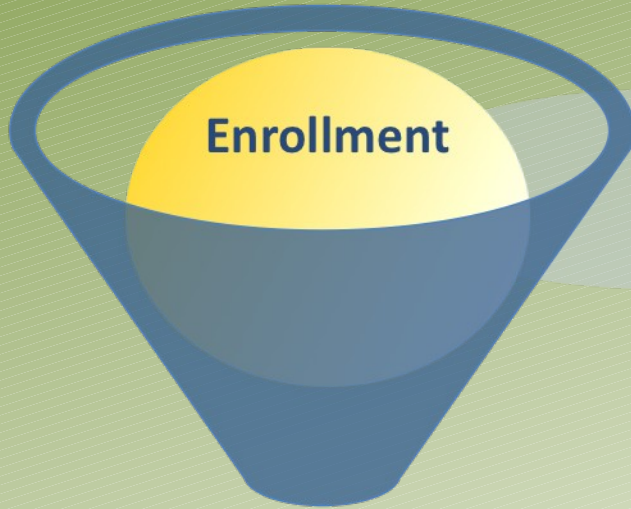
Charter School Operation

Governing Boards

- Exercise continuing oversight of charter school operations
- Adopt/maintain an annual operating budget
- Ensure retention of a CPA or auditor for the annual financial audit
- Receive/approve audit report, including findings & recommendations
- Monitor corrective action & financial recovery plan, if applicable
- Make annual progress reports to the sponsor: Student achievement data, financial status, status of facilities/plans & school personnel information



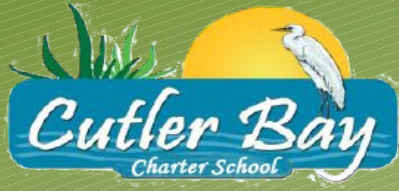

- Charter Schools will receive \$56 M Capital Outlay (for facility related expenses) per the 2011 legislative session and the District will not

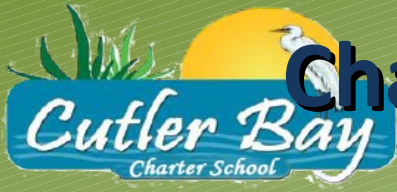
Quote from Florida Consortium of Public Charter Schools:

District schools will not receive PECO (Public Education Capital Outlay) funding this year, however, Districts continue to have several options. If construction needs arise, a school District may:

- Use certificates of participation (COPS)
- Go to the voters for an added millage allocation for major construction, maintenance or operational projects.

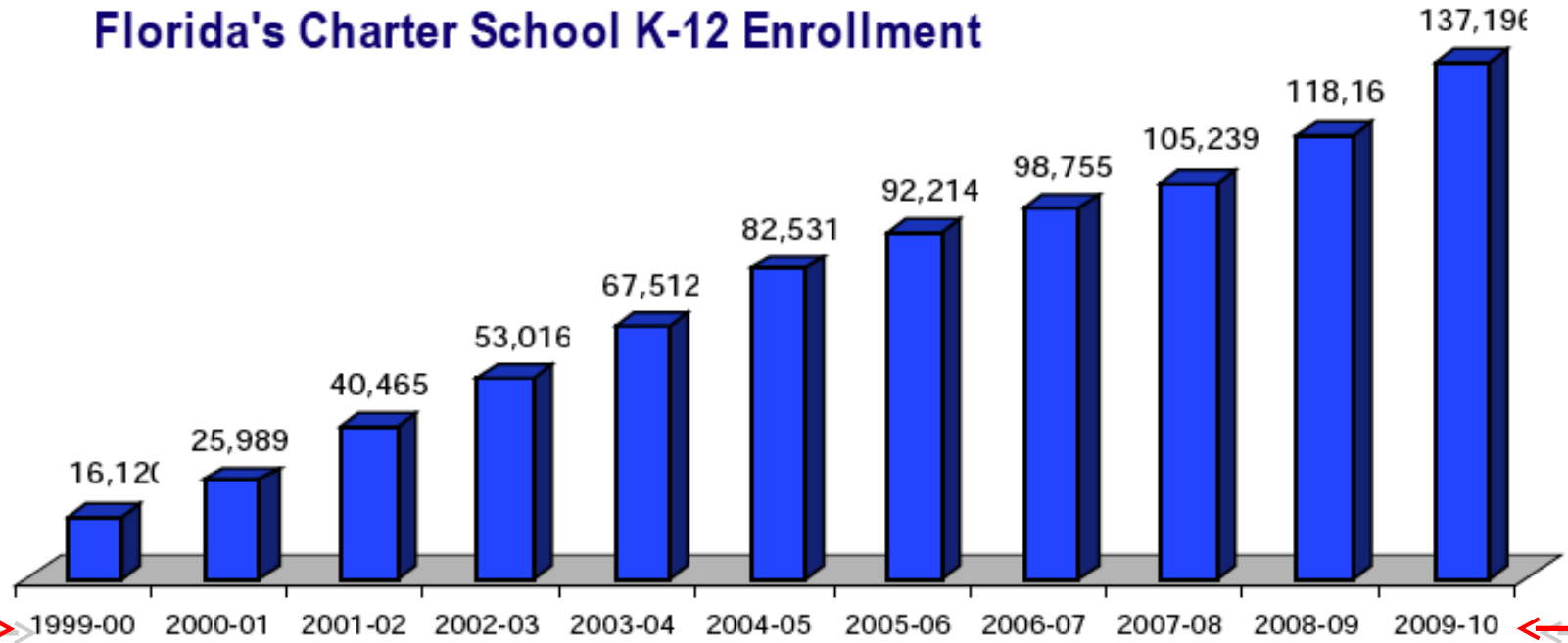
Charter schools do not have that option.

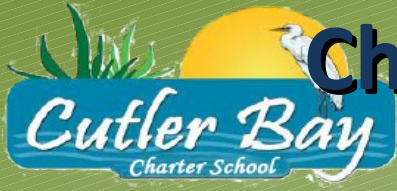

Charter School K-12 Enrollment 1999-2010

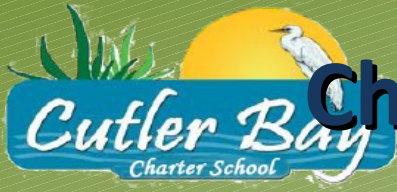
Florida's Charter School K-12 Enrollment

- **#4** Florida ranks 4th in the nation in # of charter schools
- **#7** Miami-Dade ranks 7th in the nation in charter school enrollment
- **91** Schools serving **35,500** in Miami-Dade County
- **24%** Charter schools students statewide attend Miami- Dade County Charter Schools



Charter School K-12 Enrollment 2010-2011

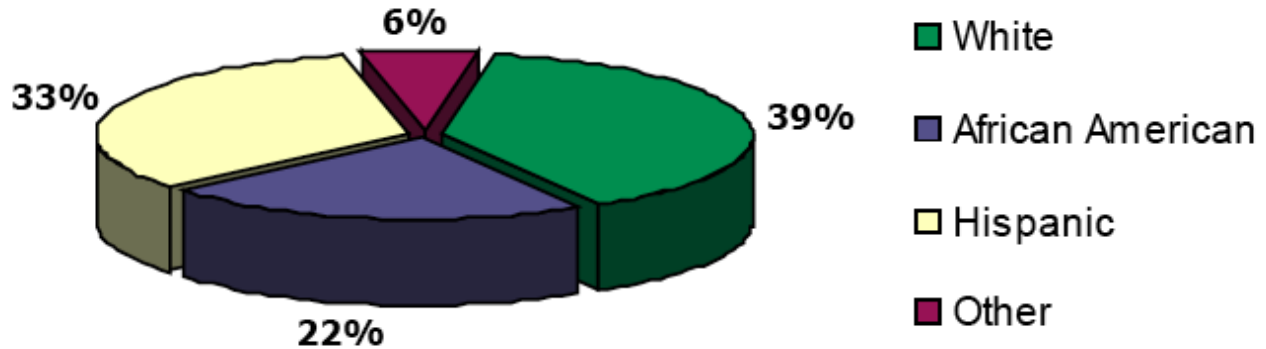
- **28%** 40 of the 91 Charter Schools classified as Differentiated Accountability Schools

- **3** Charter schools closed during 2009-2010

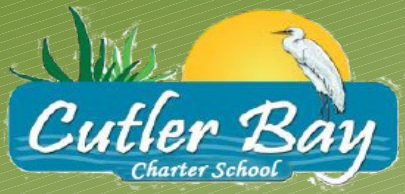

Charter Schools Have Diverse Student Populations

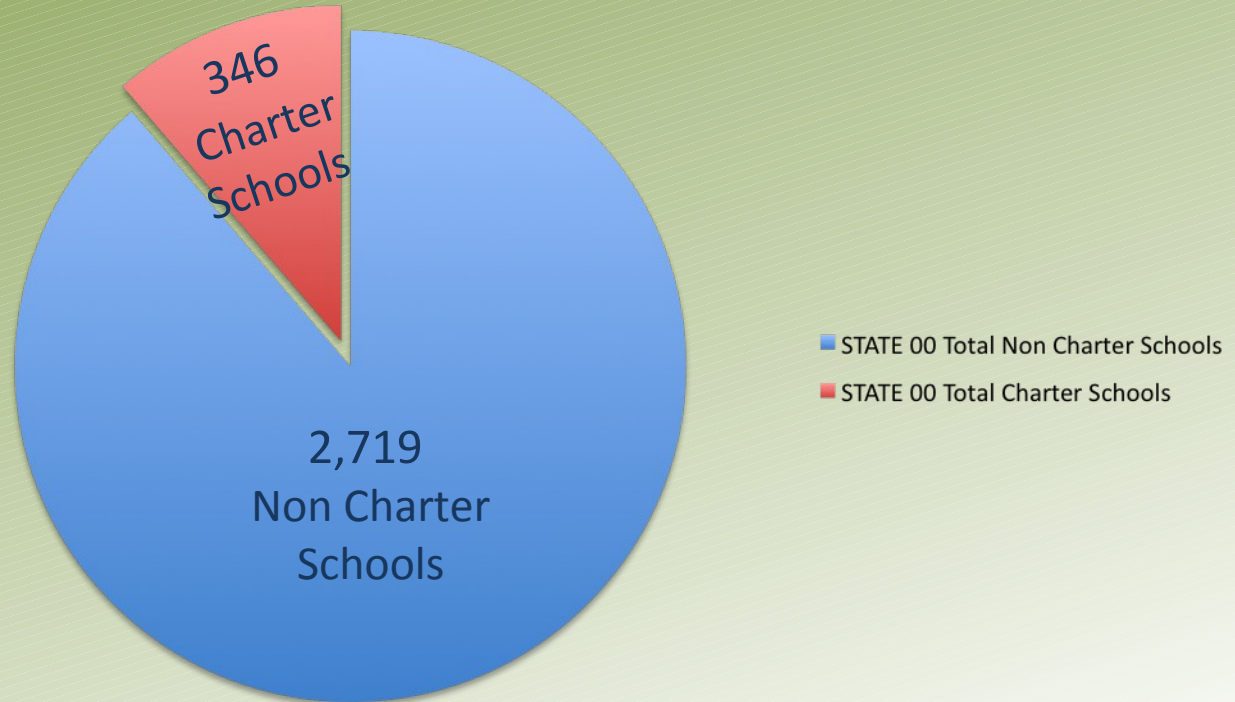
Race/Ethnicity of 2009-10 Charter School Students

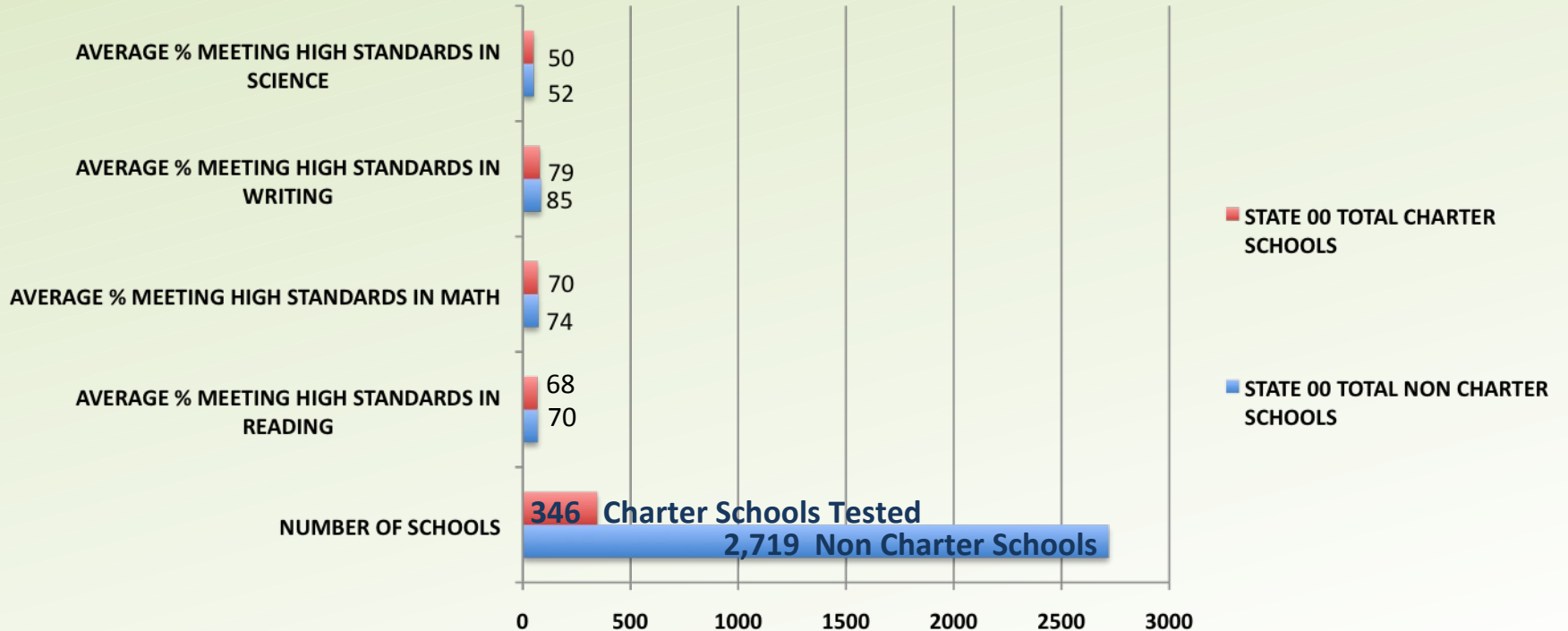

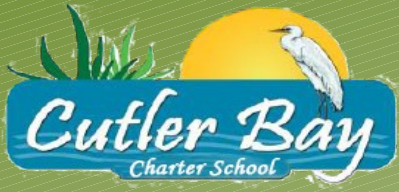




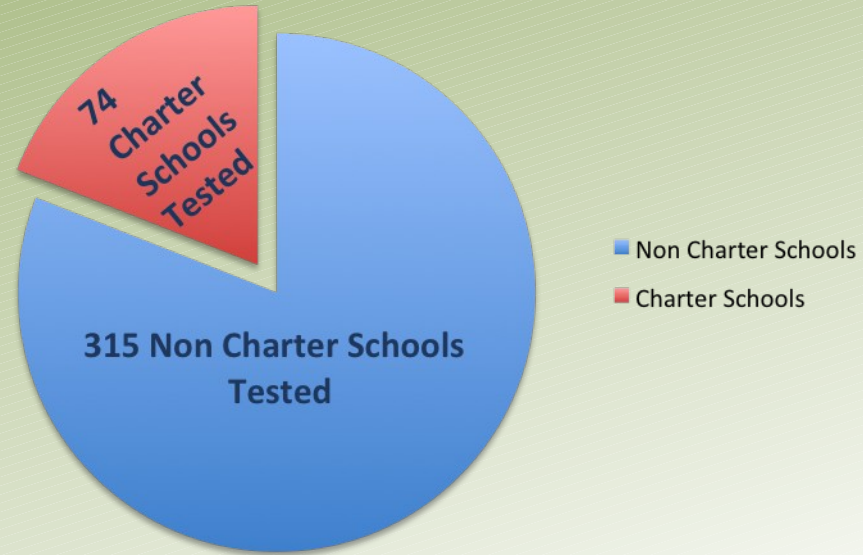
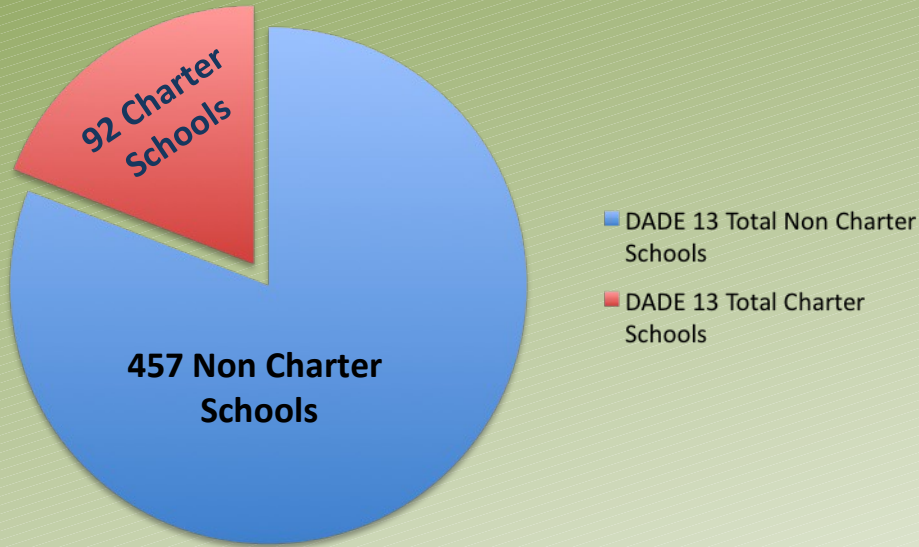
State of Florida High Standards Ratings

Charter Schools vs. Non Charter Schools 2010-2011



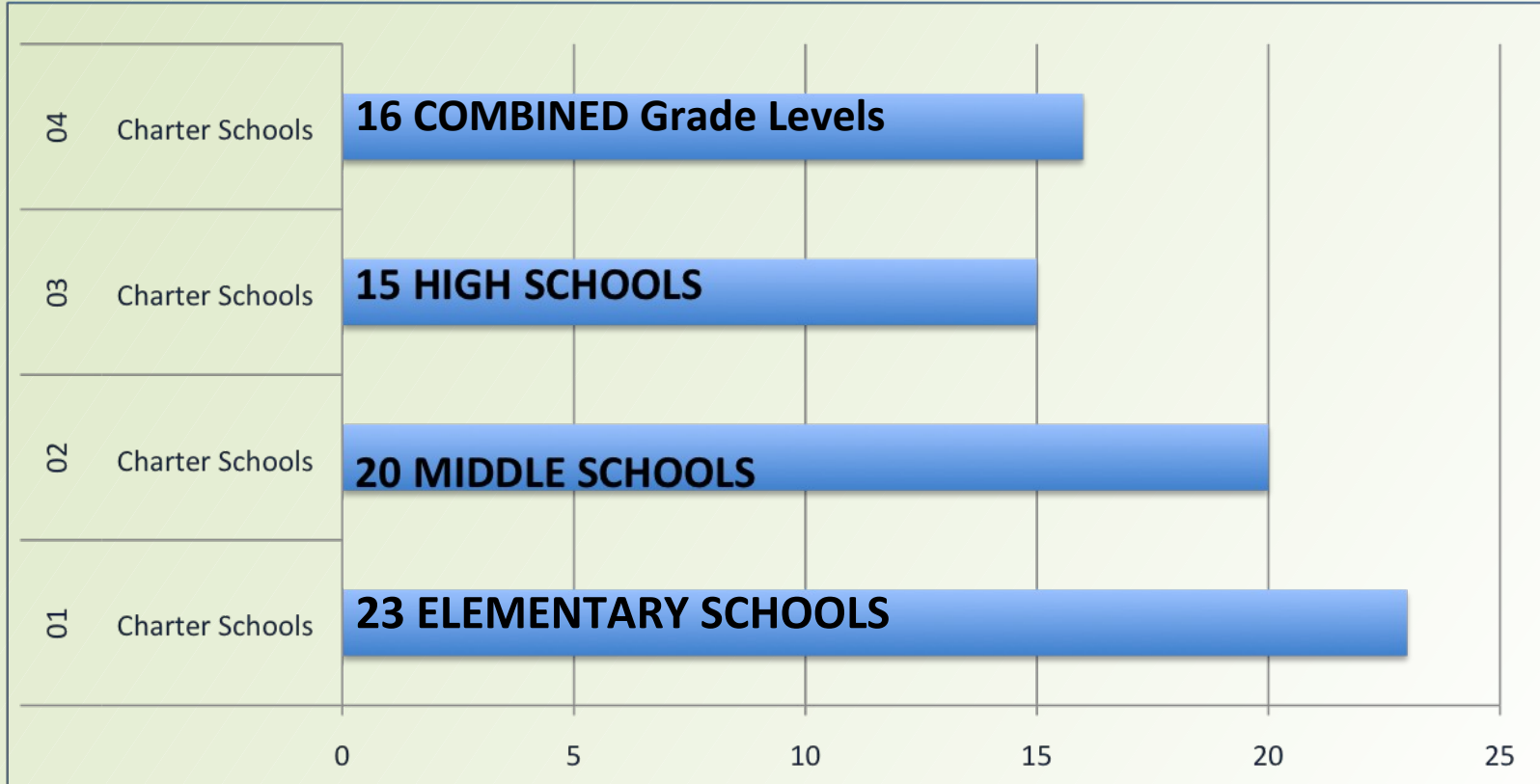


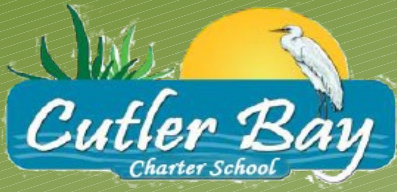
Miami-Dade Total Charter Schools





DADE COUNTY CHARTER SCHOOLS TESTED By GRADE LEVEL 2010-2011



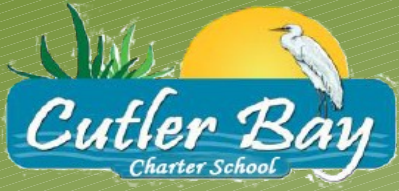

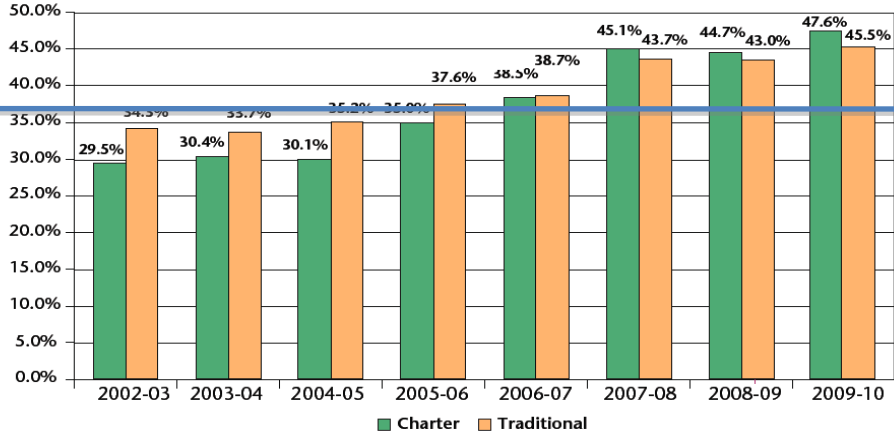

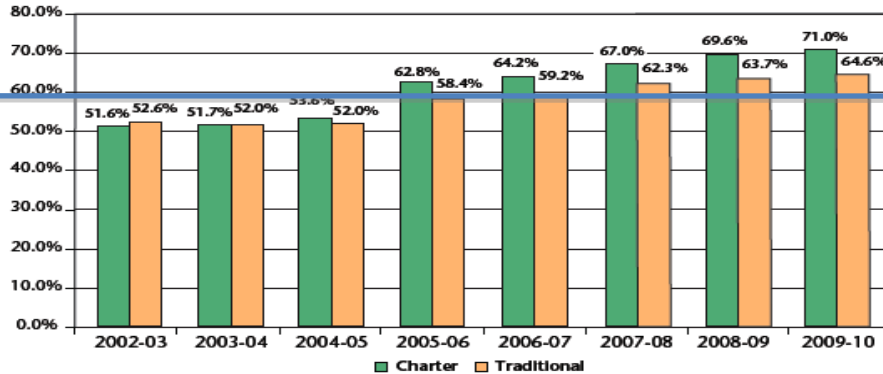
Percent of Students Scoring at Level 3 or Above on FCAT Reading

Charter Schools and Traditional Public Schools, 2003 to 2010



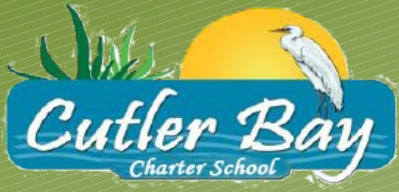

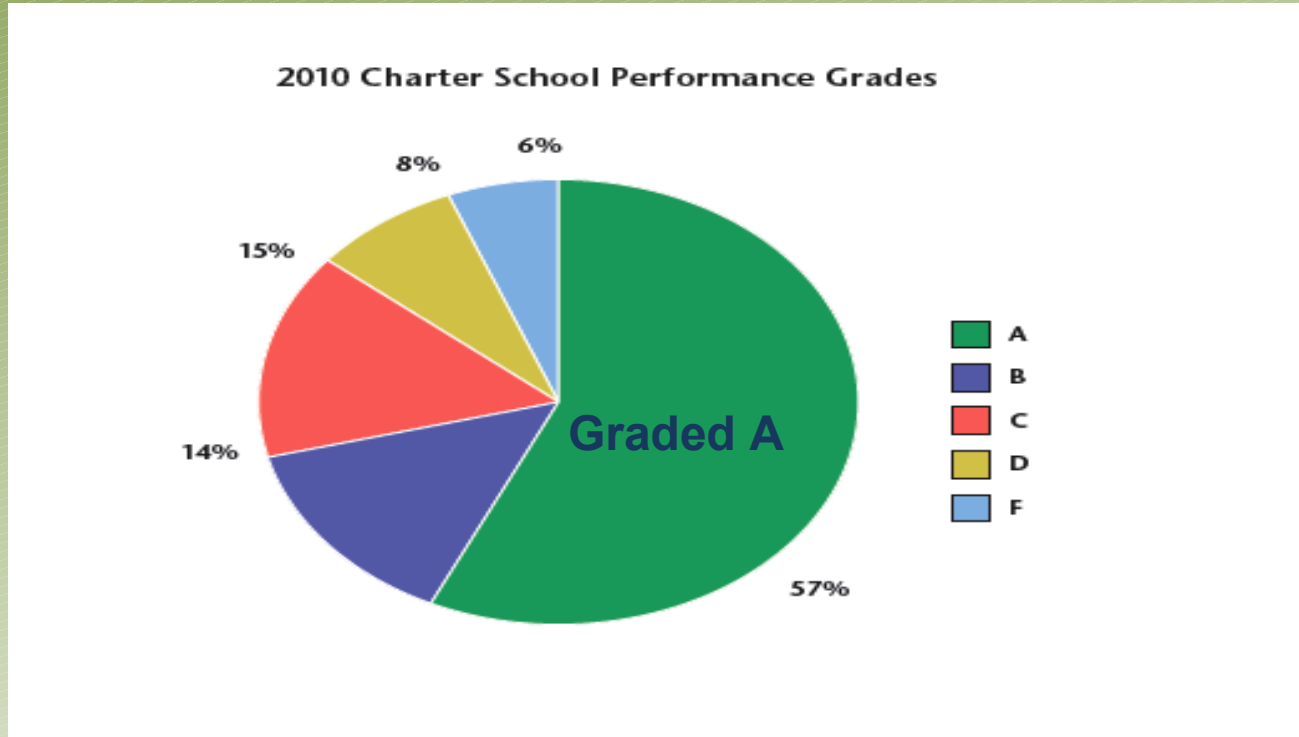
Percent of Students Scoring at Level 3 or Above on FCAT Reading

Charter Schools and Traditional Public Schools, 2003 to 2010

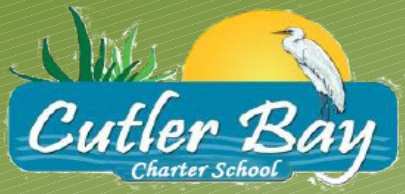

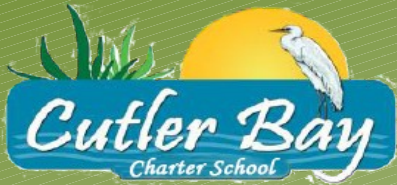
